Notes from the Director: Rick Jones

Few critics would disagree that Federico García Lorca is the most significant Spanish playwright since the Golden Age of the first half of the 17th century. Bodas de sangre (Blood Wedding) stands alongside Yerma, La casa de Bernarda Alba (The House of Bernada Alba) and the shorter Amor de Don Perlimplín con

Belisa en su jardín (The Love of Don Perlimplin and Belisa in His Garden) among his acknowledged masterpieces.

Written in 1932 and produced a year later in both Madrid and Buenos Aires, *Blood Wedding* was inspired by actual events in the Almeria region of southeastern Spain in 1928. A young woman eloped with her cousin only hours before her impending marriage to another man. The prospective bridegroom's brother ambushed and killed the cousin; the young woman was beaten and left for dead, although she recovered and lived as a recluse for nearly another 60 years.

Spectators won't take long to come to the realization that this is a play in which knives, horses and an old enmity between the families of the Bridegroom and Leonardo will figure prominently. Flowers, water and colors also carry meaning, but we need to be careful not to view everything through the symbols of our own culture. The bride's black wedding dress, for example, may be portentous, but it does not suggest reluctance or rebelliousness on her part; it is, rather, a traditional avowal that marriage lasts until death.

Finally, a brief note about the translator: Brendan Kennelly is one of Ireland's most famous poets. The student dramaturges on this project—all of them Theatre majors, all of them fluent in Spanish—were unanimous in their belief that Kennelly's, more than any of the other excellent available translations, captured both the essence and the beauty of Lorca's language. We hope you agree.
