Dramaturg's Note

Anton in Show Business, a satire about three actresses attempting to put on a production of Anton Chekhov's The Three Sisters, gives us a glimpse into the art and business of contemporary theatre. But what does Jane Martin, who usually writes plays that address issues of interest to women, know about the business of contemporary theatre? The American Theatre Critics Association awarded Anton in Show Business the 2001 Steinberg New Play Award, and writers called it "Jane Martin's very best play to date." Perhaps "Jane Martin" was finally writing about what "she" knows.

Jane Martin has been referred to as "America's best known, unknown playwright." There is no biographical information known about her. There have never been any photographs of Ms. Martin published. Nor has she made any public appearances, granted any interviews, nor spoken out about her works. Why not? Jon Jory, the spokesperson for the playwright, reportedly said that "Martin feels she could not write plays if people knew who she was, regardless of her identity or gender." However, many critics consider Anton in Show Business evidence that "Jane Martin" is in fact Jon Jory, primarily because the play could have been written only by someone of Jory's experience.

Now on the faculty at the University of Washington, Jon Jory was from 1969-2000 the Producing Director of the Actors Theatre of Louisville, where he directed over 80 plays and produced over 500. He has also directed at 15 other regional theatres, including The American Conservatory Theatre and Arena Stage. He is the founder of the Humana Festival of New American Plays, where almost all of Martin's plays premiered, nearly all of them directed by Jory.

Time and time again Jory has been asked about Martin's identity; when asked whether he would reveal her identity after her death, he replied with a laugh, "That's a press conference no one will come to. By the time I die, no one will care, anyway."

Alan Nielsen (Director), Professor of Theatre, is a published author, playwright and composer/lyricist. He has written for and directed the Original Cast since 1991. Recent directing credits include *Trudi and the Minstrel, Harvey*, and *Pericles*. He received the Teaching Excellence Award for the College of Fine Arts in both 1999 and 2003. This spring, he will be a Visiting Professor at LaSalle University-SIA in Singapore.

Steven H. Shirey (Technical Director) holds a BFA from SFA and an MFA from USC. In addition to being Technical Director since 2001, he has designed scenery for the 2004 Festival of New American Plays and lights for both Mainstage productions and operas at SFA.

Victoria Thompson (Makeup Designer) has designed makeup for The Shadow Box, Trudi and the Minstrel, Sylvia, The Yellow Boat, Quake, The Vise, Guernica, and Extremities. Tori's acting credits include The Member of the Wedding, Hair, Pericles, The Land of the Dragon, and Bacchae.
