

Dramaturg's Note

Lord Louis Mountbatten gave a defining description of Noël Coward at his 70th birthday celebration in 1969:

"There are probably greater painters than Noël, greater novelists than Noël, greater librettists, greater composers of music, greater singers, greater dancers, greater comedians, greater tragedians, greater stage producers, greater film directors, greater cabaret artists, greater TV stars. If there are, they are fourteen different people. Only one man combined all fourteen different labels - The Master."

Noël Coward, born in a suburban village near London, was the only healthy son of a struggling piano salesman. He didn't have much of an education but made up for it by reading a great deal. When he broke into the business as a child he was taken under the wing of a wealthy socialite, and he learned all about the upper crust. He used the upper class in many of his shows, like *Blithe Spirit*, and could make fun of them as both an observer and a participant.

In 1918, Coward, who had started to build his reputation in the theatre was drafted into the First World War. Not very happy with this, he used his connections to get a lighter duty. After nine months, and a minor head injury that caused him to have a nervous breakdown, he was given an honorable medical discharge. A few years later when he was established in the theatre and World War II broke out, he felt embarrassed about his non-involvement in the First World War and decided to help out with the second. After he briefly served as a secret agent in Paris, he entertained Allied troops in Europe, Africa and the Far East, usually at his own expense.

Coward also wrote *Blithe Spirit* in the midst of World War II, when death was on the mind of everyone. There was even a little controversy over Coward's making fun of death when the play first opened. *Blithe Spirit* was meant as an escape during a time of great sadness, over 65 years ago, but its humor still holds strong today.

From the Director

Noël Coward, a master of theatrical sophistication and wit, wrote *Blithe Spirit* during a stay at Portmeirion, after his London office and apartment had been destroyed in the Blitz of 1941. Coward felt the public needed something amusing and escapist during the dark days of the war. *Blithe Spirit* took him less than a week to write and became the longest running comedy in *British* theatre for three decades. Among the over 40 plays he wrote, *Blithe Spirit* was Coward's favorite and remains a 20th century classic "chestnut" throughout the world.

A program note in the original British playbill of *Blithe Spirit* stated: "If an air raid warning be received during the performance the audience will be informed from the stage. . . . those desiring to leave the theatre may do so but the performance will continue." Not unlike the difficult period of World War II, or for that matter, during any world conflict, people need a diversion from the constant "news media blitz" of death, destruction and deception. Hopefully, this production of *Blithe Spirit* will, temporarily, transport you away from today's troubled times and make your evening flow like a bone-dry martini.

Chris Flores (Stage Manager) has stage managed *Grease, The Beauty Queen of Leenane, The Night of the Iguana, Anton in Show Business,* and *The Shadow Box.* He also assistant stage managed *The Member of the Wedding* and *Hair.* Next fall he will be interning at the Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis.

Lauren Glass (Assistant Stage Manager), a sophomore from League City, assistant stage managed *Grease* and *The Night of the Iguana*. This past summer she worked as an intern for Gilbert and Sullivan Society of Houston.

Ella Rose Haag (Assistant Lighting Designer) has designed lights for How I Learned to Drive, Bonjour, Ià, Bonjour, and Picnic on the Battlefield. She also designed costumes for Chamber Music and has worked on numerous crews.

Tomy Matthys (Scenic Designer) has taught for over 40 years at SFA, where he has designed over 200 productions. His most recent scenic designs include *Grease*, *The Servant of Two Masters*, *The Night of the Iguana*, *The Tempest*, *Anton in Show Business*, *The Shadow Box*, *Trudi and the Minstrel*, and *Sylvia*.

Allen Oster (Director) is a native of North Dakota. His most recent SFA directing credits include *Bonjour, Ià, Bonjour, The Night of the Iguana, The Shadow Box,* and *Hair.* He administers the Student-Directed Productions Program and directs SFA's High School Summer Workshop. He won the Teaching Excellence Award for the university in 1996 and was named a Piper Professor of Texas in 2006.

Courtney Parker (Hair & Makeup Designer), a junior from Red Oak, appeared in *Variations on the Death of Trotsky* and worked on crews for *La Périchole, Anton in Show Business*, and *The Laramie Project*.

Mark Porter (Technical Director) comes to SFA from the Austin Theatre Alliance. He was Technical Director at St. Edwards University and at the Coconut Roof Playhouse. He has worked in television and film, on Broadway, and extensively Off-Broadway.

Catherine Restivo (Dramaturg) has performed in A Cheever Evening, Women and Wallace, and Write Me a Love Scene; she will be in The Moon Please later this semester. Cathy was also the dramaturg for Grease and The Night of the Iguana.
