Side by Side by Sondheim opened in London in 1977. As it reached Broadway a year later, **Stephen Sondheim** and his collaborators were preparing *Sweeney Todd*. Still to come were *Merrily We Roll Along, Assassins, Into the Woods, Sunday in the Park With George, Passion* and, his latest, *Road Show*, plus numerous awards and a Pulitzer Prize. Currently, as Mr. Sondheim celebrates his 80th birthday, a new revue is playing on Broadway: *Sondheim on Sondheim*. But it is our pleasure to present this fond look back at the very beginnings of his long and distinguished career.

Beauty and the Beast is produced by special arrangement with THE GERSH AGENCY, 41 Madison Avenue, 33rd Floor, New York, NY 10010 The action of the play takes place in and outside the Beast's Castle, and Belle's cottage.

The time is sometime in the Fairytale Eighteenth Century.

Like all fairy tales, "Beauty and the Beast" changes slightly with each re-telling. This beloved story was first published in France in the eighteenth century, and is now more famous than ever thanks to the 1991 animated Disney musical film version. Our rendition was written by the outstanding American playwright Constance Congdon for the Children's Theatre Company of Minneapolis in 1992.

In this version of "Beauty and the Beast," our heroine, Belle (French for "beautiful") is the daughter of a widowed middle-class merchant (in Disney's version, he is an inventor). Congdon omits Disney's Gaston, Belle's muscled suitor. And instead of servants that have been turned into objects such as a teapot and a candelabrum, our story features two animals that have been turned by magic into household "minions."

As in most versions of the story, Belle is here supplied by the Beast with lavish clothing and the comforts of a sumptuously appointed castle. Usually the Beast makes an attempt to entertain her, as well. In Congdon's play he shows her a miniature opera that also hints at the Beast's "back-story." In it, we see a noble but vain young prince that is indifferent to his people's suffering. The Greek god Zeus gives him a lonely home in the woods and some magical powers. but decrees that the prince can only be restored to his handsome human state if he "inspires love." The music for this "entertainment" has been written especially for our production by SFA graduate student Aden Kent Ramsev.

Congdon presents Belle as an intelligent, brave, mature young woman of great moral fiber, a terrific model for girls to see and emulate. Because he is hairy, scary and wild, the Beast is intriguing to many boys. In fact, in important ways he is himself a little boy that must mature in order to join human society, leaving behind his unruly behavior and becoming articulate. considerate and graceful. This transformation wins Belle's heart, and her acceptance allows the Beast to become a part of civilization. This, too, is an important model.

Whatever the differences in the details, it is this basic saga of the human journey that brings generation after generation back to a fairy tale such as "Beauty and the Beast." We hope your family gets as much enjoyment and enrichment from the story as any of the countless families that have encountered it in past centuries.

Constance Congdon was born in Iowa and grew up in Kansas and Colorado. She earned an MFA from the University of Massachusetts and has had plays produced throughout the world. Tales of the Lost Formicans is her most famous play and has had more than 200 productions worldwide. She has written several librettos for operas and eight plays for children. Winner of many grants and honors, Ms. Congdon has taught playwriting at Amherst College since 1993.

At SFA he directed Crimes of the Heart, Big River, Twelfth Night and for the 2008 and 2010 New American Play Festivals. He formerly served as head of the Theatre & Media Program at Marymount College of Fordham University, as artistic director of the London Dramatic Academy, and chairman of the Theatre & Dance Department at Dickinson College in Pennsylvania. He was producing artistic director of Jean Cocteau Repertory in New York, and has directed in regional theatres across the country. He holds an MFA in drama from the University of Texas at Austin. ALAN NIELSEN (Director--SIDE BY SIDE BY SONDHEIM), professor of theatre, is a published author, playwright and composer/ lyricist. Dr. Nielsen has written for and directed The Original Cast since 1991. SFA productions include: Rhinoceros, Follies (co-director), Charlie Brown, Into the Woods, Harvey, Trudi & the Minstrel, A Cheever Evening, Grease, Lend Me a Tenor and Schoolhouse Rock Live! Too. He re-ceived the College of Fine Arts Teaching Excellence Award in 1999, 2003 and 2010, was Guest Artist/Lecturer at Lasalle-SIA College of the Arts in Singapore (Spring 2006), and was named 2008 Outstanding Alumnus in Theatre by the University of Nebraska/Lincoln, College of Fine Arts. A PhD graduate of City University of New York, he is a member of the Dramatists Guild and the Association of Theatre in Higher Education (ATHE).

MATTHEW WEBB (Guest Lighting Designer) comes to SFA's Summer Rep from Little Rock, where he is the master electrician of the Arkansas Repertory Theatre. For the (Arkansas) Rep, Matt has lit numerous productions, including this season's Cat on a Hot Tin Roof and Frost/Nixon, as well as the world premiere of It Happened in Little Rock, a photo of which appeared on the cover of TCG's American Theatre (December '07). Recently, Matt has also designed for the University of Arkansas at Little Rock's Department of Theatre and Dance, the UALR Opera Theatre, Ballet Arkansas, Arkansas Festival Ballet, and Wildwood Park for the Arts, and he worked regionally for Stagedoor Manor in upstate New York and Greenbrier Valley Theatre in West Virginia. Matt would like to thank Professor Shattuck for generously opening his home, and the entire staff of SFA Theatre for welcoming him so warmly.

ANGELA BACARISSE (Costume Designer) has designed over 200 productions in academic and professional theatres across the country, including the Texas Shakespeare Festival. Her design work encompasses hair, makeup and lighting, as well as costumes. Her most recent SFA costume designs include The Heidi Chron-icles, The Elephant Man, Big River, Woyzeck and Twelfth Night.

DANA GLOEGE (Scenic Designer) holds a BFA from Texas Tech and an MFA from Brandeis University. He comes to SFA from the Dallas area, where he worked in commercial design; along the way he has designed hotel and restaurant interiors, juvenile furniture, television and commercial sets, personal media rooms, and, of course, stage productions. At SFA Dana has designed sets for *Twelfth Night, A Raisin in the Sun,* The Original Cast's *Christmas at the Movies* and the 2010 Festival of New American Plays.

ADEN KENT RAMSEY (Composer-BEAUTY & THE BEAST) is a graduate student in music composition in the SFA School of Music. He graduated from Tyler Junior College in 2006, where he composed music for The Musical Comedy Murders of 1940. At SFA, he has provided original music for several SFA films, and for The Piano Lesson, Twelfth Night and "Master Harold"...and the boys in the School of Theatre.
