





The purpose of this project is to see if public art enhances the experience of being in a public space. In the spring of 2014 the inaugural Sculpture For All Exhibition and Competition will be held in the Ruby Mize Azalea Garden and SFA Arboretum. Ten sculptures will be placed in the gardens for the duration of ten months. When the show opens, the public will be welcome and able to observe the art at anytime. The goal of this project is to see whether or not people react to the art being placed out into the community and if they would want to make this an annual event. Our goal is to see if artwork in society benefits the community and enhances the daily lives of the citizens in our community.

Our methodology will be to survey people in the gardens, both before and during the exhibition. Dividing the survey into three groups of people; student/faculty/staff, community member or tourist, we will be asking them a series of questions:

- 1. Do you think the artwork enhances or detracts from the garden? 2. Do you think having artwork in the community makes a difference
- 3. Would you like to see more artwork around the community?
- If the research yields positive results, our goal will be to aid in the student government's initiative to increase the amount of artwork




2. Do you think having artwork in the community makes a difference to society?


